Workshop 6:

EAHP Academy Seminar feedback: Qualitative Research Methods

Workshop description

In 2019, the European Association of Hospital Pharmacists (EAHP) held a 2 day seminar on Qualitative Research Methods.

EAHP Academy Seminar description: "What is qualitative research? Why is it used? How is it performed? When we evaluate hospital pharmacy services or develop new ones, what do we need qualitative research for? Qualitative research aims to answer the questions what, how and why. What do patients think of their medicines? Why patients do not use their medicines as intended? How do they take them instead and why? Qualitative research can be used on its own or alongside

quantitative research to answer research questions. A multitude of different qualitative methods and approaches to qualitative analysis exist and it is important to know their advantages and disadvantages to select the most appropriate for a certain health services or pharmacy practice research question.”

This workshop will apply the methodologies outlined in the seminar by focusing on: “What is qualitative research? Why is it used? How is it performed?”

Learning objectives:

- Explain what qualitative research is and why it should be used.
- Formulate qualitative research questions and prepare topic guides.
- Apply methods used in qualitative interviews, including focus groups.
